APPLE

Arkansas Black Spur: Large, late season. Dark red skin, high quality. For dessert and cooking. Keeps many months. Chill hours 500-600. Partly self-fruitful. On M-111 \$39.

Braeburn: From New Zealand. Superb, late season fruit: very crisp and tangy. More flavorful than Granny Smith. Excellent keeper. Green with dark red blush. Oct. - Nov. harvest. 700 hours and self-fruitful. On M-lll \$39.

Fuji Recent introduction from Japan that quickly became California's favorite apple. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Dull reddish-orange skin, sometimes russeted. Ripe mid-September. Excellent pollenizer for other apple varieties. Chilling requirement apparently less than 600 hours. Self-fruitful. On M-III \$39, or New Geneva \$40.

Gala (Original Gala): Wonderful dessert apple from New Zealand. Crisp, nice blend of sweetness and tartness, with rich flavor. Skin reddish-orange over yellow. Early harvest, 2-3 weeks before Red Delicious. Good pollenizer for other varieties. 500 to 600 hours. Self- fruitful. Semi-dwarf. On M-111 \$39.

Golden Delicious: Long-time favorite for its sweetness and flavor. Reliable producer, adapted to many climates. Pollenizer for Red Delicious. Mid-season harvest (September in Central Calif.). 700 hours. Self-fruitful. Semi-dwarf. On M-111 \$39.

Granny Smith: From New Zealand. Large, late, green, all purpose. Crisp, tart and an excellent keeper. Requires long summer. Thrives in hot climates. Prolonged bloom - good pollenizer for other apples. 400 hours. On M-111 \$39.

Honeycrisp: Winter hardy tree from the University of Minnesota. Fruit is crisp and juicy with an aromatic flavor. Striped red over yellow color. Stores well. Ripens from late September to late October. Pollenized by Gala, Granny Smith, Empire, McIntosh and Red Delicious. Semi-dwarf. On M-111 \$39.

Pink Lady: (Cripps Pink). Hot climate apple from Western Australia. Very crisp, sweet-tart, distinct flavor, good keeper. Skin reddish-pink over green when ripe. White flesh resists browning. Harvest begins late October in Central CA, about three weeks after Fuji. Self-fruitful. 400 to 500 hours. Semi-dwarf. On M-III - \$42.

Red Delicious: (Bisbee Spur) Sweet, crisp, flavorful — perhaps the best Red Delicious. Harvest in early fall. Small, compact tree. Good pollenizer for most other apples. 700 hours. Pollenized by Liberty, Granny Smith, Golden Delicious, Fuji, and Gala. Semi-dwarf. On M-III \$39.

Sierra Beauty: Favorite late apple in Northern CA. Yellow with red blush. Rich, sprightly flavor, moderately sweet. Excellent fresh or cooked. Good keeper. 700-800 hours. **Semi-dwarf on M-111. \$40.**

Winter Banana Apple: Large, round, especially beautiful apple - pale yellow, waxy skin blushed with rosy pink. Crisp, tangy, juicy flesh is highly aromatic with a mind, banana like flavor. Great dessert apple and cider apple. Good keeper and excellent pollenizer for other apples. Less than 400 hours. Partly self-fruitful. Biggest crops if cross pollenized. On M-III. \$40.

Yellow Newton Pippin: Yellow green, late, firm, crisp, slightly tart, superb flavor. For peak flavor and acid/sugar balance, wait to harvest until cheeks are blushed yellowish-green. Good keeper. Famous for cooking, also excellent fresh or dried. Vigorous tree. Late Oct./early Nov. harvest. 700 hrs. Self-fruitful. On M-111 \$39.

APRICOTS

Autumn Glo: Late season apricot with tremendous flavor. Ripens in the first two weeks of August in the Central Valley. Fruit is medium sized with good color. One of the highest scoring apricot varieties to date at Dave Wilson Nursery fruit tastings. 500 hours or less. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Blenhiem (Royal): All purpose freestone, sweet, aromatic and flavorful. Early bloom. Late June harvest in Central CA. 400 hours or less. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Brittany Gold: This sweet apricot is a very consistent producer in the test orchard. It has proven to perform in tough climates, where no other apricot will. This large, firm fruit has an extremely long season, hanging for 3 weeks or more at the end of July. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Harcot Apricot: From Canada. Frost hardy with late bloom. Resists brown rot and perennial canker. Medium to large fruit ripens early to mid June in Central CA. Sweet, juicy, rich flavor one of the best. 700 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Perfection Apricot: Very productive, hardy tree. Fruit is very large, sweet and juicy. Performs well where Spring frost is a problem. **On Citation \$40**.

CHERRY

Bing Cherry: Large, firm, juicy, sweet, nearly black when ripe - superb flavor. Large, vigorous tree and the No.1 cherry! Pollenized by Black Tartarian, Van, Rainier, and Lapins. Also Stella in colder climates. 700 hours. On Mazzard \$36.

Black Tartarian Cherry: Medium sized, nearly black, sprightly flavor and early season. Vigorous, productive tree. 700 hours. Pollenizer required - interfruitful with all popular sweet cherries. On Mazzard \$36.

Craig's Crimson Cherry: Self-fruitful, natural semi-dwarf, perhaps the finest sweet cherry: dark red to nearly black, medium to large size, wonderful spicy flavor with very firm texture. Mature tree size about 2/3 of standard. Mid-season. Estimated chilling requirement: 800 hours. On Maxma 14 \$45.

Royal Rainier Cherry: Large, yellow cherry with slightly more red blush than Rainier. Excellent flavor, taste test winner. Ripens early. 500 hours. Pollenized by Bing, Black Tartarian and Lapins. On Mazzard \$36.

Stella Cherry: Large, nearly black, richly flavored sweet cherry; similar to its parent, Lambert. Late harvest. Is self-fruitful and pollenizes Bing. 400 hours. **On Newroot 1 \$45**.

JUJUBE

Li Jujube: "Chinese date." The most popular jujube variety. Round-shaped fruits, reddishbrown, dry and wrinkled, sweet and chewy (like dates) when fully ripe in early Fall. Attractive, easy to grow tree, hardy, drought-resistant, virtually pest and disease free. Requires long, hot summer. Very low chill requirement. Self-fruitful. On Jujube \$48.

NECTARINE

Arctic Babe Miniature: A genetic, dwarf, white nectarine. Reliable, self-fruitful. Ripe in early June. 700 hours or less. On Lovell. \$44.

Atomic Double - Red Flowering Nectarine: This fruiting and flowering nectarine is sure to amaze. Deep red, double flowers act as a beacon in your yard and it sets fruit as well. A white nectarine that ripens in mid to late June. The fruit is medium to large with sweet, white flesh. 500 hours. Self-fruitful. On Nemaguard \$42.

Necta Zee Miniature Nectarine: Sweet, very flavorful, yellow freestone with beautiful red skin. Mid-June to early July in central California. Vigorous growth to 6 ft. Best Self-fruitful, miniature nectarine. 400 hours or less. On Lovell. \$40.

Double Delight: Sensational fruit - consistently the best flavored, yellow nectarine. Magnificent, double pink flowers. Dark red, freestone fruit is sweet with unusually rich flavor. Heavy bearing tree. 300 hours. Self-fruitful. **On Citation \$40**.

Harko Nectarine: One of the highest scoring in fruit tastings. Cold hardy, Canadian variety has showy, large, single pink blossoms. Tolerant of bacterial spot and brown rot. 800 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$43.

Zee Glo: Taste test winner. Delicious late summer fruit with classic, zesty, nectarine flavor. Superb balance of acid and sugar. Attractive, dark red skin. Showy pink blossoms in spring. 600 hrs. Self-fruitful. On Citation . \$43.

PEACH

Garden Gold Miniature Peach: Delicious yellow freestone. More vigorous than other miniatures. Later bloom, less susceptible to frost damage. Showy blossoms. 5-6 ft. tree. 500 hours or less. Self-fruitful. On Lovell \$39.

Arctic Supreme Peach: Two-time, taste test winner. Large, white flesh, nearly freestone when fully ripe. Red over cream colored skin. Sweet and tangy, fine delicate flavor, firm texture. Peak quality reached a short while after picking. Harvest late July/early August in Central Calif. 700 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$43.

Babcock White Peach: Long-time favorite, white fleshed freestone. Sweet and juicy, aromatic, low in acid. Widely adapted (low chill requirement, yet not early blooming)! 250-300 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Carnival Peach: Very late season, yellow freestone. Large, red skinned fruit ripens late Sept./early Oct. in Central CA. Vigorous, productive tree. 500 hours or less. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$44.

Eva's Pride Peach: Delicious, fine flavored peach with very low chilling requirements. Medium to large sized yellow freestone. An early season peach for moderate climates. Harvest 3 weeks before July Elberta. 100-200 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Frost Peach: Resistant to peach leaf curl. Delicious, yellow freestone. Slight red blush over greenish yellow to yellow skin. Heavy bearing, excellent for canning or eating fresh. July ripening. Showy pink bloom in Spring. 700 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$42.

Gleason Early Elberta Peach: Also called improved Alberta or Lemon Alberta. Reliable, frost hardy, yellow freestone. Juicy, rich flavor. Can/freeze/fresh. 800 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Gold Dust Peach: Best, early season, yellow peach. High overall scores for flavor and appeal. Semi freestone. All purpose peach, superb for eating fresh. Not an early bloomer. 550 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Indian Blood Cling: Large, late season canning peach. Red skin, red flesh, and rich flavor. Blooms late, sets heavy crops. 800 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$35.

Indian Free Peach: Taste test winner. Large freestone, firm crimson and cream colored flesh. Tart until fully ripe, then highly aromatic with a rich, distinctive flavor. Highly resistant to peach leaf curl. Late season. 700 hours. Needs another nectarine or peach to pollenize. On Citation. \$40...

J.H. Hale Peach: Old variety, still one of the best. Very large, firm, superb flavor. Use fresh or canned. Ripens late season. Excellent frost hardiness. 800 hours. Another peach or nectarine needed to pollenize. On Citation \$33.

July (Kim) Elberta Peach: Also called Early Alberta. Reliable, heavy crops. Juicy, sweet, very flavorful, yellow freestone fruit for canning, freezing, or fresh use. 400-500 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Octoberfest Peach: Late season, medium size, cling peach. Firm yellow/red skin with yellow flesh streaked red from the center. Ripens late Sept. to mid Oct. in Central CA. Use fresh and for freezing. Heavy bearing tree. 700-800 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$43.

O'Henry Peach: Popular fresh market, yellow freestone now available for home planting. Large, firm, full red skin, superb flavor. Ripens early to mid-August in central Calif. Strong, vigorous, heavy bearing tree. 750 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Suncrest Peach: Large very firm, fine flavored, yellow freestone. Frost hardy blossoms, consistent producer. Harvest late July in central Calif. 500 hours. Self-fruitful. On Lovell \$35.

PEAR

Bartlett Pear: World's most popular pear! Early - mid season, high quality, tolerates hot summers. 500-600 hours. Self-fruitful in Western U.S. On OHxF333 \$40.

Bosc Pear: Long and narrow shape, brown skin. Superb quality. Harvest late Oct. Enjoy fresh or cooked. 500-600 hours. Pollenized by Bartlett or other pear. On OHxF333 \$40.

Comice Pear: The gift pack pear. Sweet, aromatic, fine texture, superb quality and flavor - one of the best! Short neck, greenish-yellow skin with red blush. Late harvest. 600 hours. Self-fruitful in Western U.S. or plant with Bartlett. On OHxF333 \$40.

Seckel Pear: Connoisseurs' favorite. Sweet, flavorful, aromatic, spicy...perhaps the best. Russeted brown skin. Resists fire blight. 500 hours. Self-fruitful. On OHxF333 \$40...

Sensation Red Bartlett High quality Bartlett-type fruit with attractive red skin. relatively small tree. Self fruitful in most climates of Western U.S. 700 hrs. On OHxF333 \$38.

Shinaeiki Asian Pear: Juicy, sweet, refreshing, crisp like an apple. Easy to grow. Keeps well. Harvest late July/early August. Bright yellow skin. Vigorous, heavy bearing (usually by the second year). Self-fertile. On OHxF333 \$40.

20th Century Asian Pear: "Apple Pear" Juicy, sweet, mild-flavored fruit is crisp like an apple. Keeps well. Easy to grow, heavy bearing, small tree. 300-400 hours. Self-fruitful or pollenized by Shinseiki, Bartlett, or other. **On OHxF333 \$40**.

Warren Pear: Excellent quality dessert pear - and highly resistant to fireblight. Medium to large, long-necked fruit with pale green skin, sometimes blushed red. Smooth flesh (no grit), is juicy and buttery with superb flavor. Good keeper. Cold hardy to -20°F. From Mississippi. 600 hours. Self-fruitful. On OHxF333. \$40.

PERSIMMONS

Fuyu -Jiro Persimmon: "Apple Persimmon" Medium size, flat shape, still crunchy when ripe. Non-astringent. Cool or hot climate. Hardy, attractive tree, practically pest free. Fall harvest. 200 hours. Self-fruitful. On Lotus \$60.

Giant Fuyu Persimmon: Larger, not so flat as Fuyu. Crunchy when ripe like Fuyu. Sweet, flavorful, non-astringent. Easy to grow in cool or hot climates. Fall harvest. 200 hours. Self-fruitful. On Lotus \$60.

Hachiya Persimmon: Large, deep orange-red, acorn-shaped. Hot summer required to mature the fruit. Sweet, flavorful, astringent until soft-ripe. Mature fruit can be frozen and thawed to ripen. Productive / ornamental. 200 hours. Self-fruitful. On Lotus \$60.

PLUMS

Beauty Plum: Sweet, flavorful plum, more widely adapted than Santa Rosa. (More productive in cool, rainy climates). Red over yellow skin, amber flesh streaked red. 250 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Burgundy Plum: Maroon colored skin and semi-freestone flesh. Sweet, with little or no tartness and a very pleasing, mild flavor. High taste test scores. Prolonged harvest. Very productive. Narrow, upright habit. 300 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Elephant Heart Plum: Home-orchard favorite - large, heart-shaped fruit with sweet, juicy, richly flavored, firm red flesh. Dark reddish-purple mottled skin. Long harvest season - September in Central Calif. Hardy, heavy bearing. 500 hours or less. Pollenize with Beauty or Santa Rosa. On Citation \$40.

Italian Prune: Large purple skin, freestone. Rich flavor, very sweet when fully ripe. Fresh/dried/canned. Vigorous, cold hardy tree. Late bloom. Late summer harvest. 800 hours. Self-fruitful. On Citation \$40.

Late Santa Rosa Plum: Medium to large reddish-purple skin, red streaked amber flesh. Tart-sweet with rich flavor when fully ripe. Harvest about one month after Santa Rosa. 400 hours or less. Self-fruitful. On Myro 29C \$33.

Satsuma Plum: Long time, favorite plum in *CA*. Mottled, maroon over green skin. Dark red meaty flesh. Sweet, mild, not tart. Excellent for jam. Harvest late July. 300 hours. Pollenized by Santa Rosa or Beauty. **On Myro 29C \$33**.

Weeping Santa Rosa Plum: One of most flavorful, aromatic, Japanese plums when fully ripe. Beautiful, 8-10 ft. tree with weeping growth habit. Easily espaliered. 200-400 hours. Self-fruitful. On Myro 29C \$35.

PLUERRY

(plum x sweet cherry)

Sugar Twist Pluerry: Interspecific. Harvest mid June. Red skin, yellow flesh. Pollenized by Flavor King Pluot, Emerald Beauty Plum, and most mid to late blooming Pluot, Pluerry, or plums. 500 hours or less. On Citation \$48.

PLUOTS

Dapple Dandy Pluot: Taste test winner. Creamy white and red-fleshed freestone with wonderful plum-apricot flavor. Skin greenish-yellow with red spots, turning to maroon and yellow dapple. August harvest in Central CA. 400-500 hours. Pollenized by Flavor Supreme Pluot, Flavor King Pluot, Santa Rosa Plum, Catalina or Burgundy Plum. On Citation \$44.

Flavor King Pluot: Interspecific. Taste test winner. Unique plum - apricot hybrid with sensational bouquet and sweet, spicy flavor. Reddish-purple skin and crimson flesh. Harvest mid August in Central CA. Naturally small tree. 400 hours or less. Pollenized by Flavor Supreme or Dapple Dandy Pluot and Santa Rosa or Late Santa Rosa plum. On Citation. \$44.

Splash Pluot: Interspecific. Small to medium sized, red-orange fruit with very sweet orange flesh. Round to heart shaped fruit is excellent eaten fresh, dried, or in desserts. Pollinized by Santa Rosa Plum or Flavor Grenade Pluot. 400 hours or less. RIS Plum on Myro 29C \$42.

NUTS

All-In-One Almond: Semi-dwarf. No. 1 almond for home orchards. Heavy crops of soft-shell nuts with sweet, flavorful kernels. Hot summer required to ripen. 15 ft. tree, very winter and frost hardy. 300-400 hours. Self-fruitful. On Marianna \$40.

Carmelo Walnut: Late leafing and blooming, adapted to colder climate than Hartley or other popular English walnuts. Very large, well filled nut. 700 hours. Self-fruitful. On No. Calif. Black \$54.

Franquette Walnut: Last English walnut to leaf out. Less suseptible to Spring frost damage. Very large tree - excellent shade. Fair production of well sealed, thin shelled, high quality nuts. Pollenizer for Hartley. 700 hours. Self-fruitful. On No. Calif. Black \$68.

Hartley Walnut: Long-time, No. 1 walnut in CA for its quality and dependability. Large, thin shelled, well sealed nut. Light colored, flavorful kernel. 700 hours. Self-fruitful. On Paradox. \$54.

4-n-1 Apple: Fuji - Gala - Golden Delicious - Granny Smith. On M106 \$79.

4-n-1 Cherry: Rainier - Bing - Lapin - Van. On Mazzard \$79.
